1920's

FRENCH 75

This gin cocktail was first introduced in 1927 in the movie "Here's How" by Judge Jr. | \$12

Tanqueray 10, Fresh Lemon Juice, Simple Syrup, Chandon Brut

1930's

MINT JULEP

The Mint Julep became the official drink of the Kentucky Derby in 1938 | \$11

Woodford Reserve, Simple Syrup, Mint Leaves

1940's

MOSCOW MULE

In 1941, this sparkling cocktail was created to help sell ginger beer and imported vodkas | \$11

Belvedere, Simple Syrup, Fresh Lime Juice, Ginger Beer

1950's

PIÑA COLADA

This frozen beverage was first created by Ramón "Monchito" Marrero Pérez in 1954 in San Juan | \$10
Papas Pilar Blonde Rum, Pineapple Juice, Coconut Cream

1960's

WHISKEY SOUR

Although first talked about in 1870, this drink became fashionable again in the 1960's | \$10
Bulleit Bourbon, Fresh Lemon Juice, Simple Syrup

1970's

HARVEY WALLBANGER

This cocktail first made its debut in literature in 1971 | \$11
Prairie Vodka, Galliano, Orange Juice

1980's

THE BRAMBLE

The Bramble was created by Dick Bradsell in London in the 1980's | \$11
Bluecoat Gin, Crème de Mure, Simple Syrup, Fresh Lemon Juice

1990's

WHITE RUSSIAN

Although invented in 1965, this drink saw a surge in popularity following the release of the 1998 film "The Big Lebowski" | \$11
Ciroc Vodka, Varnelli Caffé Moka, Cream

2000's

COSMOPOLITAN

Created in 1988, this cocktail's popularity sky rocketed this decade due to its presence in the hit TV show "Sex and the City" | \$11
Ketel Citroen, Fresh Lime Juice, Cointreau, Cranberry Juice

2010's

MANHATTAN REVIVAL

Known as one of the first classic cocktails, the Manhattan has seen a huge comeback as a favorite in bars all over the world | \$11
Michter's Rye, Montanaro Rosso, Bitter Truth Aromatic Bitters
